On 22nd April, 2022, the Environmental Development Committee in collaboration with the Department of Film Studies organized a programme to commemorate the occasion of Earth Day.

The first half of the event witnessed a competition among students exhibiting power point presentations and talking about initiatives that could be taken to preserve and protect the planet as well as cited alternatives and lifestyle changes that could bring about positive impact on nature.
