accountability, and cooperation that lead them to serve the underprivileged.

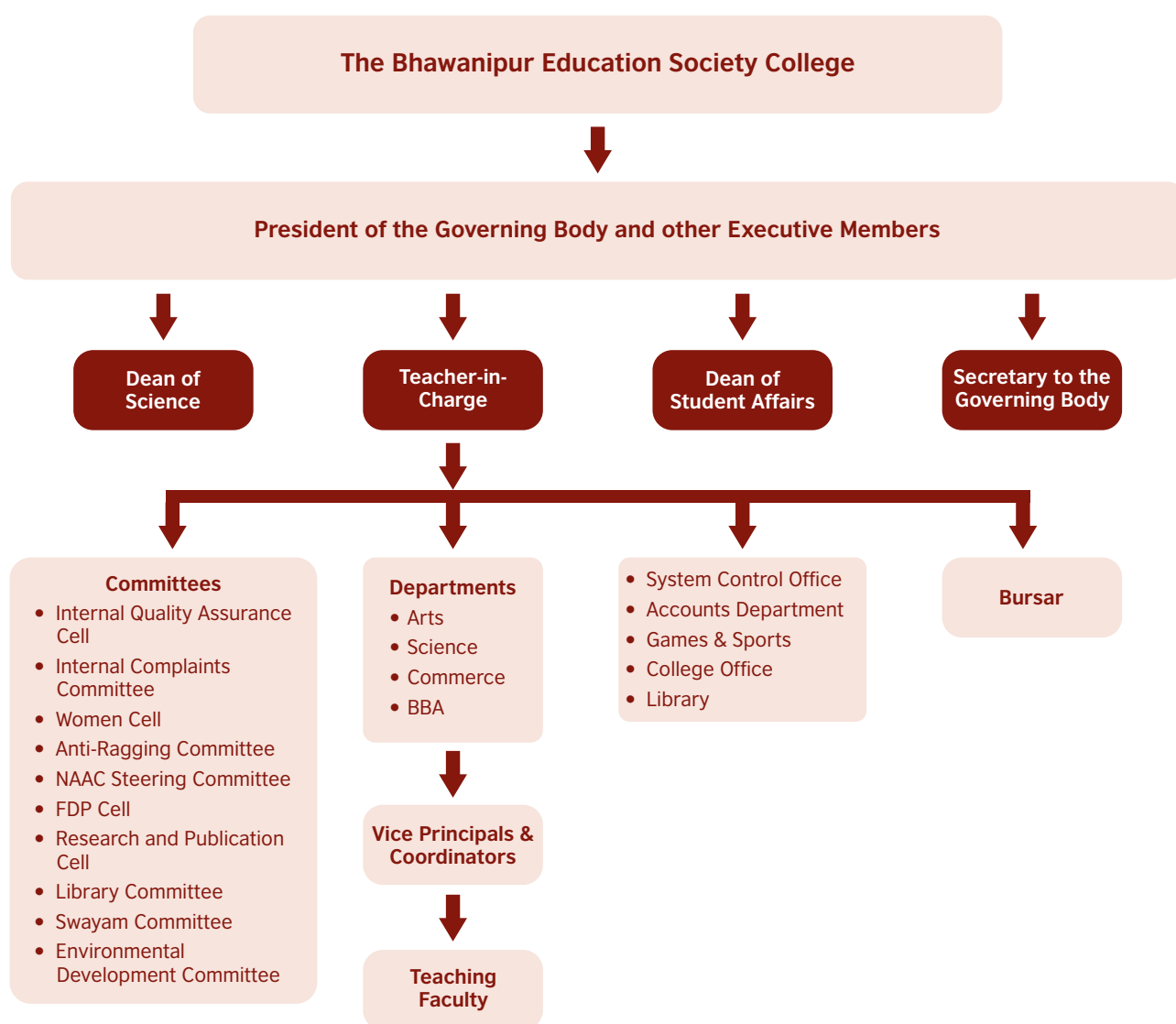
- To empower all students, especially girls to unleash their potential to leverage their professional competence.

IQAC Activities during the Academic Year July 2024 - June 2025

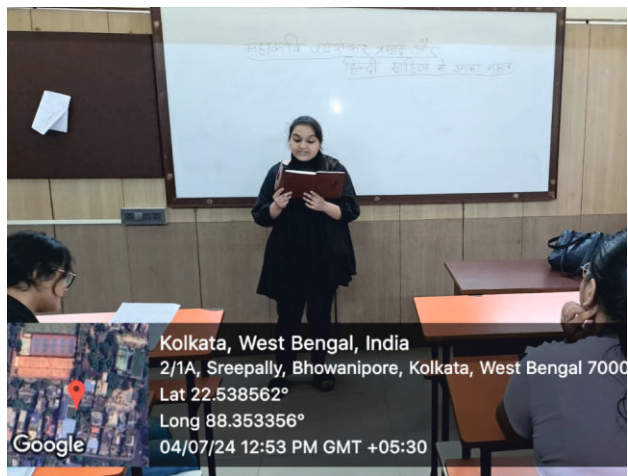

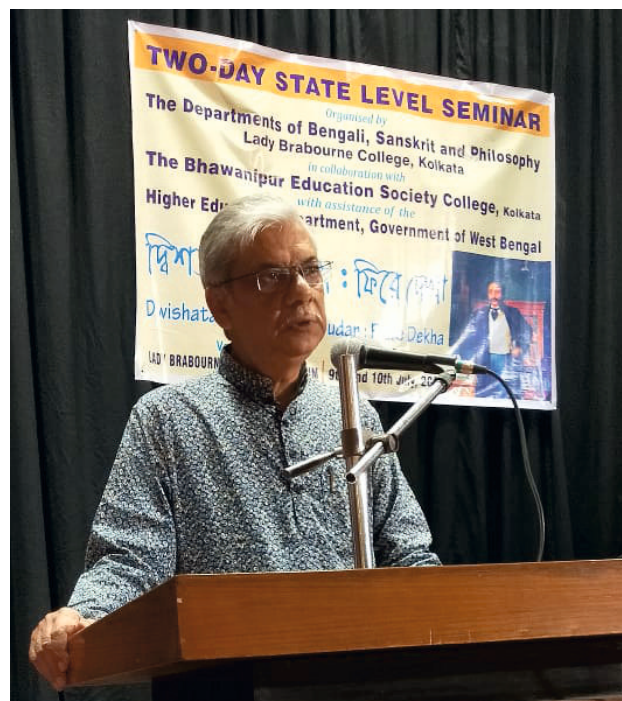

In the course of seven days, 11 resource persons delivered engaging sessions that covered various aspects of the empowerment of women in a range of areas such as the economic sector, the psychological sphere, and the empowerment of women in film among many more. This FDP, whose co-ordinator was Dr. Sampa Sinha Basu kicked off with an inaugural keynote address by Prof. Siuli Sarkar that established the concept and goal of the next few days. The first session by Ms Swati Bhattacharjee covered the economic empowerment of women where she spoke about the inequitable laws when it came to the financial independence of women. She took key examples from arcane and restrictive ownership laws in the past, part of which has also trickled into the future. This was followed by an engaging session by Dr. Biswajit Roy on the empowerment of women in the 20th century. The second day began with a deep dive into the psychological Sphere and women empowerment by Dr. Jhuma Basak where she iterated on key



factors shaping the social and psychological position of women that affected their power and empowerment in societal spheres. It was followed by Dr. Shenjuti Dutta's detailed exploration of the empowerment of women in Film. As one of the most popular formats of media, Dr Dutta explored the power and role of female characters in various popular films such as Pushpa 2 where she also depicted femininity and transcending social roles. The third day began with Dr. Sudakshina Ghosh who explored nineteenth-century literature and the empowerment of women in the aspect of the seminal works produced in that era. The discussion was carried forward to the fourth day by Sri Abdul Kafi who disseminated the role of politics and women's empowerment, depicting key aspects of the features that affected policy-making and society at large. The discussions of the fifth day included Dr. Chitrita Banerjee's discussion of 20th-century literature and its role and impact on women's empowerment. The sixth day witnessed Smt Rushati Sen speak about the role of nineteenth-century society in shaping and contributing to the empowerment of women in society. This was followed by our international speaker and resource person, Prof. Mobarra Siddiqua who held an engaging session on the social status of women after 1971, exploring key metrics contributing to and affecting the role and status of women in key areas. The final day of the seven-day FDP on 'Society and Literature: Empowerment of Women' was highlighted by Dr. Debanjana Chakraborty's session on the empowerment of women and governance, which was followed by Smt. Urba Chaudhuri's exploration of the empowerment of women in education. The FDP was fruitful and engaging, providing the participants with a renewed perspective of women's empowerment as well as identifying central aspects that contribute positively and negatively towards the upliftment of women towards an equitable society.

Outcome of the Event: The seven day FDP aimed at familiarising the participants with the various spheres of women's empowerment such as social, political, educational, and more. The different sessions by the eminent speakers gave them insights into major factors that affected and shaped the growth and rise of women in key sectors of society. The discussions of seven days aimed to address and identify key areas of improvement towards the social standing of women as well providing food for thought towards the sustainable development of society to ensure an equitable and harmonious power structure.

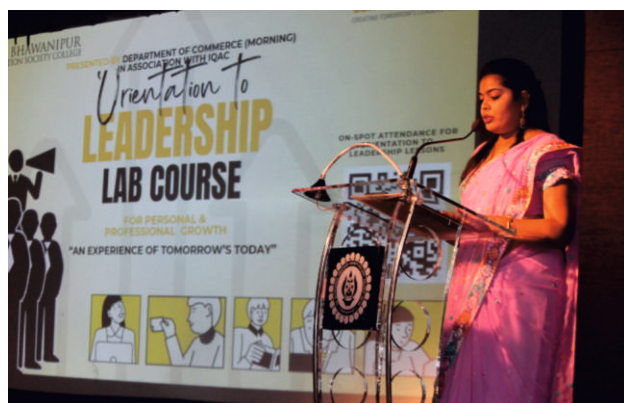
Objective of the Event: The seminar aimed to provide students with essential insights into effective leadership principles and practices in the contemporary business environment. The session

The aim was to equip faculty with practical knowledge to guide students in data handling, analysis, and dashboard creation, essential for project work in Semester 3.



Brief Description of the Activity: The Economics undergraduate coursework at the University of Calcutta has been given a facelift under the CCF 2022 syllabus. New topics like Microsoft Excel, Power Query and Power BI and others have been introduced for the first time. The workshop organised by the Department of Economics on 6th and 7th January 2025 was an attempt to familiarize the undergraduate Economics faculty from various colleges under the University with Power Query and Power BI. This workshop was a sequel to the workshop on MS Excel that was organised by the department in April 2024. Over a period of two days the resource person took the attendees through the various aspects of Power Query and Power BI through lectures and hands on training at the computer laboratory (Room No. 442) of the BESC. The Economics honours syllabus under CCF 2022, requires semester 3 students to undertake a primary survey, do a statistical analysis using Microsoft Excel worksheets and, write and present a report using an interactive dashboard. Dr Mukherjee introduced the concept of data extraction, transformation and loading in Power Query and ultimately used this technique to create interactive dashboards in Power BI. Objective of the Event: The primary objective of this event is to introduce undergraduate students to the foundational principles of emerging Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning (ML) concept and how AI/ML techniques can be integrated into scientific research, particularly in modelling and simulating the unimolecular dissociation dynamics of van der Waals complexes.

Brief Description of the Event: The lecture series titled "Chemistry in Times of Artificial Intelligence (Lecture Series-1)" was organized by the Department of Chemistry, The Bhawanipur Education Society College, in collaboration with Uluberia College, Howrah, as part of a joint initiative under the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed between the two institutions. The event was also held in association with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and the Seminar Committee (Science Section) of The Bhawanipur Education Society College.

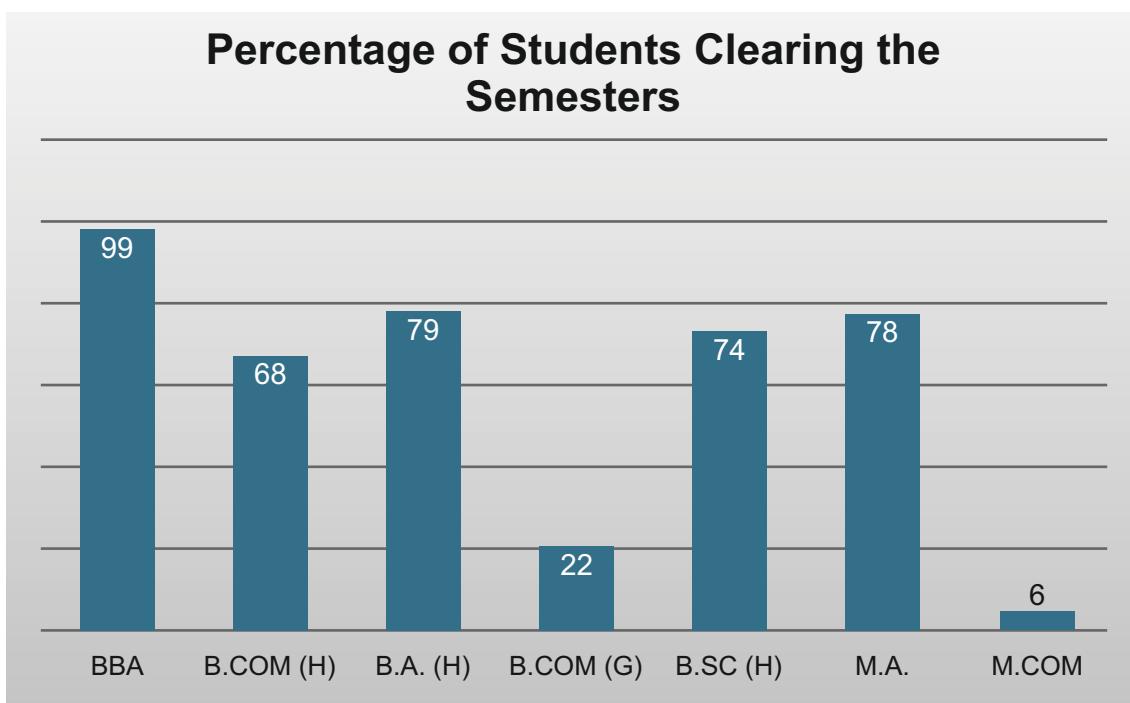

Key Highlights of the Talk: Abhinaba Upadhyay, drawing from his experiences at CERN, elaborated on the collaborative nature of scientific research and the vital role played by diverse academic disciplines in advancing fundamental physics. He emphasized that CERN is not exclusively for physicists; rather, it thrives on the contributions of experts from multiple fields, including engineering, computer science, material science, mathematics, and even life sciences. He illustrated how various specializations converge at CERN to facilitate research in particle physics.

Impact on the Audience: The talk captivated the 41 students and faculty members in attendance, sparking curiosity about the interdisciplinary applications of physics. Many students who initially believed that CERN was relevant only to physicists were surprised to learn about the wide array of opportunities available for individuals

from various scientific domains. Abhinaba also encouraged students to explore internship and research opportunities at CERN, detailing the application process and the skills required to participate in such prestigious programs. His journey from being a student to becoming a doctoral researcher at CERN served as an inspiration for aspiring scientists.

Conclusion: The event concluded with an engaging Q&A session, where students inquired about the challenges and rewards of working at CERN, as well as the future of interdisciplinary research in fundamental physics. The talk successfully broadened the perspectives of the attendees, reinforcing the idea that science is a collective endeavor, where knowledge from various fields intertwines to unravel the mysteries of the universe.

The Department of Physics extends its gratitude to Abhinaba Upadhyay for sharing his experiences and insights, and for inspiring the next generation of researchers. This session has undoubtedly left a lasting impact, motivating students to think beyond traditional academic boundaries and explore collaborative opportunities in global scientific endeavors.

The sessions were thoughtfully

Objective of the Activity: The field trip was conducted in relation to field work-based

components in the core paper of Research Methods; (CBCS) and Skill Enhancement (SEC) paper on; Academic Writing; in semester V (CBCS) and III (CCF) respectively. The students had conducted surveys on separate topics in the museum for writing a field report.

Brief Description of the Activity: In the museum, students came to learn about the history of Alipore Correctional Home, Panopticon Model as a form of Prison architecture, the incidents for martyrdom of the freedom fighters convicted in the Correctional Home, histories of rigorous imprisonment of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, Rishi Aurobindo, Kazi Nazrul Islam, Bidhan Chandra Roy and other leaders of the national struggle for independence. The Police Museum within the compound was useful to learn about the various conspiracy cases filed against the freedom fighters by the colonial government. The contribution of female freedom fighters of Bengal at various times in the national struggle for independence was also important to learn about women's participation in the freedom movement. A part of the museum recreated the prison lifestyle of the convicts of pre-independent India to help the visitors experience the brutality of imprisonment.

Outcome of the Activity: Through this field visit the students learnt about the techniques of field research, report writing and the significance of museum as an institution of preserving the rich socio-political history of the nation.

During the visit, students received a detailed tour of the facility and witnessed the complete feed production process, from raw material procurement to final packaging under the company's Nouriture brand, which includes poultry, cattle, and aqua feed products. The experience was enriched with interactive sessions led by company representatives, covering topics such as feed formulation, nutritional science, quality assurance, and sustainable practices. A Q&A session provided further insights into industry challenges and innovations. The visit was guided by Ms. Aberi Chakraborty and supported by Mr. Amit Saraogi, MD & CEO of Anmol Feeds, whose warm hospitality was deeply appreciated.

Outcome of the Activity: The industry visits to Anmol Feeds Pvt. Ltd. proved to be a highly educational and insightful experience for the students. It enhanced their understanding of the livestock feed manufacturing process and its critical role in supporting agricultural productivity. Students gained firsthand knowledge of industrial operations, quality control mechanisms, and sustainable practices in feed production. The interaction with industry professionals inspired many students to consider future careers in agribusiness, manufacturing, and related sectors, bridging the gap between academic learning and real-world application.

Brief Description of the Activity: The industrial visit to Rollick Ice Cream's manufacturing facility was designed to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the functioning of a large-scale FMCG (Fast-Moving Consumer Goods) production unit. The students were taken through a step-by-step walkthrough of the entire ice cream manufacturing process. Beginning with the sourcing and mixing of raw ingredients, the tour covered vital stages such as blending, aging, freezing, and final packaging, offering students a close-up view of how a product transitions from raw materials to the finished goods ready for the market. One of the major highlights of the visit was observing Rollick's high-volume production capability, which exceeds 41,000 litres per day. This gave the students insights into how technology, precision, and planning intersect to meet high





consumer demand efficiently. The company's data-driven approach to production planning, which helps forecast demand and optimize resource allocation, was explained in detail. Students also explored the company's advanced cold storage techniques that ensure freshness and long shelf life of the products, a crucial aspect in dairy and frozen food segments. Rollick's innovative strategy to penetrate rural markets through its "Paanch ka Pachaas" delivery policy – ensuring timely, low-cost deliveries – was particularly appreciated as an example of localized, inclusive business planning. The visit further emphasized the importance of regulatory compliance, where students learned about the relevance of FSSAI (Food Safety and Standards Authority of India) and EIA (Environmental Impact Assessment) guidelines in food production. The company's commitment to quality control was demonstrated through its use of in-house laboratories where regular testing ensures product safety and consistency. In addition, students were introduced to the company's approach to waste management and sustainability. Rollick's efforts toward Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) were showcased through their practices of local sourcing, supporting nearby communities, and adopting environmentally responsible measures. The hospitality of the Rollick team, who not only facilitated a detailed and engaging tour but also provided opportunities for students to sample the final products, made the experience both informative and enjoyable. Overall, the visit offered a rare and valuable opportunity to connect academic knowledge with real-world industrial practices, giving students a solid understanding of the scale, complexity, and responsibility involved in operating a successful FMCG enterprise.

Objective of the Activity: The objective of the industrial visit was to provide students with practical exposure to the complete jute manufacturing process and its operational dynamics. It aimed to bridge the gap between academic learning and industrial practice, particularly in areas like cost accounting, supply chain management, and sustainability. The visit also intended to enhance students' understanding of quality control, product grading, and financial documentation used in large-scale production.

Brief Description of the Activity: The Department of Commerce (Morning) organized an industrial visit for 36 students from Semester II and IV, accompanied by three faculty members—Prof. Moumita Dutta, Prof. Samreen Alam, and Prof. Harshvardhan Sanghi—to Hastings Jute Mill, the second-oldest jute mill in India. Renowned for its legacy and strong commitment to sustainable manufacturing, the mill has an impressive daily



production capacity of approximately 170 metric tonnes and specializes in the production of high-quality, food-grade jute bags. The objective of the visit was to give students a comprehensive view of the industrial jute manufacturing process. During the visit, students observed the entire lifecycle of jute production—starting from the procurement and grading of raw jute sourced from regions like North Bengal, Tarkeshwar, and Assam. The process began with softening and treating the raw jute using emulsions of oil, water, and detergents, followed by the carding stage, which aligns the fibres. Multiple rounds of drawing and drafting were used to produce uniform slivers that were later spun into threads. These threads were then wound and woven into fabric using a mix of traditional and modern looms. The woven material underwent calendaring, stitching, inspection, and packaging before final dispatch. Beyond the technical processes, students also learned about the grading system (TD1 to TD10) used for classifying jute quality and how it determines the application of the end products—ranging from food packaging to industrial-grade materials. Additionally, the visit included insights into operational and financial aspects such as batch costing, profit estimation, cost sheet preparation, and quality control procedures, including random sample inspections. The interaction with on-ground staff helped students understand real-time decision-making in manufacturing. Overall, the visit offered a rich learning experience by blending practical exposure with classroom concepts in cost accounting, supply chain management, and eco-friendly industrial practices. It gave students a holistic understanding of jute production and the complexities involved in managing large-scale, sustainable industrial units.

Outcome of the Activity: The visit provided students with direct exposure to the complete jute manufacturing process, helping them understand each stage—from raw material sorting to the final packaging of products. It enabled them to connect

academic concepts in cost accounting, supply chain management, and sustainable practices with real-world industrial applications. Students gained valuable insights into quality control mechanisms, product grading systems (TD1–TD10), and financial documentation like cost sheets and batch costing. The experience also deepened their appreciation for eco-friendly production and operational efficiency in traditional industries. Overall, the visit enhanced their practical knowledge, critical thinking, and industry readiness.

7. Name of the Activity: Industrial Visit to Dough As You Like factory

Objective of the Activity: Industry-Academia Interface

Brief Description of the Activity: The students from Semester II and IV of B.Com along with 4 faculty members left for a factory visit to Dough As You Like factory on June 24, 2025. Industrial trip was organised to make our students thorough with production, storage, distribution etc. This visit was an opportunity for the students to learn about all the different varieties of cakes and savouries. They took an entire tour across the production line, from the baking room to packaging rooms, it was a great





addition to their direct experience and understanding. The students were familiarized with the product range of the company, technology of production, labeling, packaging, promotions, advertising as well as transportation and sales. Additionally, they were introduced to the company's first innovative products like the blueberry cheese cake and Tiramisu that were launched in the year 2023. The visit was very interactive and informative as the students received practical knowledge aligned with industry practices. This exposure will be beneficial and equip them for the practical job world.

Outcome of the Activity: The industrial visit to the cake baking industry was highly informative and insightful. Students gained hands-on knowledge of the cake baking process, including the machinery used, such as various types of ovens, mixers, and conveyors. They also learned about the quality control measures and assurance processes in place to ensure consistent product quality. Additionally, students gained valuable insights into food safety and hygiene practices, which are crucial in the food processing industry. By observing industry professionals at work, students were able to relate theoretical concepts learned in class to real-world applications, developing their problem-solving skills. The visit also provided students with an understanding of industry standards, regulations, and certifications required for cake baking and food processing. Overall, the industrial visit was a valuable learning experience that bridged the gap between theory and practice."

1. Name of the Activity: Eco-Express: An Outreach-cum Extension Programme

Organising Unit: Department of Economics in association with NSS



Date/Duration: 10th July 2024

No. of Participants: 23 semester 4 students from the Department of Economics, 5 NSS volunteers, 6 faculty members 20 school children from Panch Darshiya Vidyalaya, Kolkata and 3 members of HUM, an NGO

Objective of the Activity: The primary objective was to provide an enjoyable and interactive educational experience that sparked curiosity about the history and operations of the Indian Railways and broadened the children's knowledge and appreciation for the same.

Brief Description of the Activity: On 10th July 2024, the Department of Economics, in association with the National Service Scheme (NSS) of The Bhawanipur Education Society College (BESC), organized an extension-cum-outreach program to the Howrah Rail Museum, Howrah. Railways have always played an important role in the economic growth and development of India. Indian Railways continue to play a crucial role in shaping the economy of our country. It is, therefore, necessary for the present generation to be made aware of the history and role of railways in India. With this objective in mind 28 students from the college and 20 children from the Panch Darshiya Vidyalaya, run by the NGO – Humanities for U & Me (HUM) visited the Railway Museum in July. The journey began at 10 am from the college campus. At Park Circus the group was joined by the 20 school children aged between 5 to 10. The children were accompanied by the members of HUM, making the

bus journey to the museum lively and engaging. The group arrived at the Howrah Rail Museum by 11:00 a.m. and participated in an enthusiastic introductory session. The students from BESC were paired with individual children from the NGO to guide them through the museum. The primary objective was to provide an enjoyable and interactive educational experience that sparked curiosity about the history and operations of the Indian Railways and broadened the children's knowledge and appreciation for the same. The museum features old locomotives, vintage carriages, and artifacts showcasing the evolution of Indian Railways. There were photographs depicting the transition from steam engines to electric engines and from small coaches to AC coaches. The exhibits also included old railway uniforms, models of railway track, track changing levers, metro rail, and a life-like replica of the Howrah Railway Station. The "Howrah Station" model also offered a toy train ride around the museum. While waiting for the toy train ride, an interactive session ensued where the children introduced themselves, shared their favourite activities, and showcased their talents. The day concluded with a delightful lunch at the rail coach-turned-restaurant within the museum.

Outcome of the Activity: The outreach programme was a resounding success, enriching the lives of the children from the HUM organisation and instilling a sense of social responsibility in the students of Bhawanipur College. Special thanks were extended to the management of Howrah Rail Museum and NGO HUM by Mr Nawaid Khan was presented with a token of appreciation from BESC for their support and cooperation.

2. Name of the Event: Wheels of Wisdom: A Technological Voyage to Ashok Leyland Dankuni

Time: 10 am - 5 pm

No of Participants: Faculty: 09; Students: 42

Objective of the Activity: The primary objective of this industry visit was to bridge the gap between academic knowledge and real-world industry practices, offering students insights into the integration of technology and automation in the heavy vehicle sector.

Brief Description of the Activity: The visit to the Ashok Leyland Factory at Dankuni began at 11 am, with a warm welcome from Mr. Shivnath Gour, the Manager of the facility, along with his assistant. During the visit, the students were given a detailed tour of the manufacturing plant and its various divisions, including the automated sections responsible for vehicle maintenance and service. Mr. Gour and his assistant provided valuable insights into how automation and technology have revolutionized the maintenance and servicing of heavy vehicles. They explained the intricacies of automation and its role in streamlining processes that were traditionally manual and time-consuming. Students were particularly intrigued by the application of programming and software systems that enhance mechanical engineering tasks, making the maintenance process more efficient. The visit emphasized the increasing role of programming and automation in the heavy vehicle industry, providing students with a deeper understanding of how their skills in computer



science can be applied beyond traditional IT sectors. The visit also highlighted the growing demand for tech-savvy professionals in industries like manufacturing and automotive services.

Outcome of the Activity: The students left the visit with a newfound awareness of the numerous opportunities available in the heavy industry sector. They realized that their computer science skills, often associated with IT industries, could also be instrumental in transforming mechanical engineering processes. This visit encouraged them to broaden their career horizons and explore roles in industries where technology and automation are key drivers of innovation and efficiency. The event successfully achieved its goal of bridging the gap between academia and industry, and the students left with an enriched perspective on the integration of technology in diverse fields. The event provided a valuable opportunity for students to witness the synergy of technology and manufacturing, fostering a deeper understanding of the potential career avenues available in both the IT and industrial sectors.

3. Name of the Activity: An Academic Tour to NML, Jamshedpur

Organizing Unit: Departments of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, and Electronics

Date/Duration: 27th to 30th November 2024

No. of Participants: 27- Teachers: 9, Students: 18

Objective of the Activity: To provide students and faculty with experiential learning opportunities that combine academic enrichment, practical exposure to industrial research, and ecological exploration, thereby enhancing their understanding of scientific concepts and environmental conservation.

Brief Description of the Activity: The Departments of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, and Electronics organized an academic tour to Jamshedpur from 27th to 30th November 2024,



involving 9 teachers and 18 students. The tour commenced on the afternoon of 27th November, with participants meeting at Howrah Station at 1:30 PM and boarding the Vande Bharat Express at 2:35 PM, arriving at Tatanagar Junction by 5:45 PM. The first day included settling into accommodations and an evening meal at 8:30 PM. On the second day, after breakfast, the group visited the National Metallurgical Laboratory (NML), a premier research institution. Here, participants engaged in guided tours of state-of-the-art laboratories, interactive sessions with scientists, and demonstrations of advanced metallurgical technologies. Lunch was provided at NML, followed by visits to Jubilee Park and Domahani. At Jubilee Park, participants observed sustainable landscaping and urban ecology practices, while Domahani offered a study of riverine ecosystems at the confluence of two rivers. The third day featured an excursion to Dolma Forest after breakfast, where students and teachers explored the forest's biodiversity and discussed sustainable conservation practices. Lunch was served on-site, and the evening was spent relaxing at the hotel. The final day was dedicated to local sightseeing to Dimna Lake. Dimna Lake provided insights into water conservation and local biodiversity. Lunch was provided during the sightseeing journey. In the afternoon, participants departed for Tatanagar Junction to board the return Vande Bharat Express at 4:10 PM, arriving back at Howrah Station by 7:40 PM, concluding the tour.

Outcome of the Activity: The academic tour to Jamshedpur was highly successful, achieving its objectives of blending academic learning with practical and ecological experiences. The visit to NML deepened participants' understanding of materials science and metallurgical processes, linking theoretical studies with real-world industrial applications. The excursions to Dolma Forest, Jubilee Park, Dimna Lake, and Domahani fostered a greater appreciation for environmental conservation and ecological systems. Additionally, the tour promoted teamwork, critical thinking, and interdisciplinary collaboration among students and faculty. The positive feedback from participants highlighted the tour's impact on their academic growth and personal development, inspiring them to pursue further studies and careers in science and technology. Overall, the tour was a transformative experience that significantly enriched the educational journey of all attendees.

4. Name of the Activity: Educational Tour to Pelling and Ravangla, Sikkim

Organising Unit: Department of Economics

Date/Duration: 21st April 2025 – 26th April 2025

No. of Participants: 23 students and 04 faculty

Objective of the Activity: To conduct two primary surveys on HOUSEHOLD DEMOGRAPHIC TRENDS and TOURISM PATTERNS IN PELLING/RAVANGLA in order to bring out patterns and effects of tourism on local ways of life and shed light on the various socio-cultural-economic aspects of the informal sector in Sikkim, with specific focus on the Pelling tourism industry.

Brief Description of the Activity: The tour started from Howrah station in the afternoon of 21st April 2025. After a night halt at Siliguri, the group of 23 students and 4 teachers reached Pelling on 22nd April 2025 afternoon. After lunch, the students went to the lower Pelling marketplace to conduct



the aforementioned survey based on the questionnaire prepared under the guidance of the teachers. They took first-hand interviews to collect data on the preference patterns of tourists in Pelling and its interactions with the local tourism industry by surveys on both ends of the contact, i.e. the consumers and the local homestay based firms that make up the tourism industry in Sikkim. In the next two days, the students were provided with the opportunity to further their knowledge on local tourism via the following sight-seeings (the majestic Namchi Chardham, the serene Ravangla Buddha Park, the pious Khecheopery Lake, Kanchenjunga Waterfall, Orange garden, Temmi Tea Garden, the new Pelling Skywalk, to name only a few). In addition to such academic motivations, the tour provided the students with roller-coaster experiences of long drives in the mountains, Mt. Kanchenjunga view during sunrise, chilly bonfires, and last but not the least, the amazing food and hospitality of the hills. The students, with their teachers, returned to Howrah station on Saturday, less tired and more overwhelmed by the week spent together, gone by as if in a blink.

Outcome of the Activity: The educational trip was to initiate the students towards experiences and observations beyond the strict confines of the book. The department had provided each student with exercise books and stationery to pen down their thoughts regarding the tour. It is evident from these tour diaries that though enjoyment with friends was an agenda, they were not oblivious to



their surroundings. While they could appreciate the scenic beauties, they could also realize the infrastructural bottlenecks that characterize Sikkim tourism industry (Pelling and Ravangla). Concern about the environmental hazards like landslides, frequent floods, pollution, changing weather conditions, unplanned constructions, etc. that are affecting the tourism industry both from the demand and supply linkages finds mention in their observations. The sample survey was just to encourage such a spirit of social research among the students in order to prepare them for future research projects and other job market perspectives.

5. Name of the Activity: Educational Trip to Birla Industrial and Technological Museum

Date/Duration: 10th May 2025

Time: 11 am - 4 pm

No. of Participants: Eleven (11) students and twelve (12) teacher participants were present from the Physics department of the Science Section of The BES College.

Objective of the Event: Physics, Mathematics and Chemistry helps in studying underlying laws of Nature. Though Physics and Mathematics are abstract in nature, it is always possible to design and set up some special kind of experiments which can demonstrate physical laws and their Engineering applications. Birla Industrial and Technological Museum provides many experimental demonstrations on the well-known laws of Physics and Mathematics.

Brief Description of the Activity: Department of Physics in collaboration with Cultural and Educational trip committee Science Section, approved by IQAC, The BES College organized an educational trip to BIRLA INDUSTRIAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL MUSEUM on 10 th May 2025. Students from the Physics Department along with



the Faculty and support staff participated in the programme. Students enjoyed science project demonstrations and attended 3D shows. They experienced the coal mine ambience from the exhibit of the museum. The high voltage show was extremely interesting and informative. Students learnt a lot and were greatly inspired by the live projects.

Outcome of the Activity: In this BITM Tour students were exposed to different hands-on experiments which helped the students to build an insight on the theories they studied under the University Curriculum. From this Tour students were inspired and got ideas to build their own projects.

6. Name of the Activity: Industrial Visit to Parle, Salasaar Industries, Dhulagarh, Howrah

Organizing Unit: Department of Chemistry

Date/Duration: 15th May 2025

No. of Participants: 30 (Students + Teachers + Lab staffs)

Objective of the Activity: The purpose of the industrial visit was to provide students with practical exposure to manufacturing processes, quality control, and industrial operations, and to



understand how theoretical concepts are applied in the real-world production environment.

Brief Description of the Activity: The visit to the Parle Biscuit Company began at around 12:30 PM. The company officials warmly welcomed the group and gave a brief introduction to the history of Parle, its products, and its market presence. **Factory Tour and Observations:** Students were guided through different sections of the biscuit production process, including:

Raw Material Handling: Explanation on the procurement and storage of raw materials like flour, sugar, and other ingredients.

Mixing and Moulding: Demonstration of how ingredients are mixed in large machines and then moulded into biscuit shapes.

Baking: Observation of large ovens used for baking biscuits at controlled temperatures.

Packaging: Automated packaging systems that wrap and pack biscuits in hygienic conditions.

Quality Control: Insight into the rigorous quality checks conducted at each stage of production. Strict hygiene and safety protocols were followed throughout the visit. The company staff answered students' queries and provided useful insights into the management and operations of a large-scale FMCG industry.

Outcome of the Activity: The industrial visit to Parle Biscuit Company was highly informative and

provided students with a clear understanding of the functioning of a biscuit manufacturing unit. It helped bridge the gap between theoretical learning and practical application, and motivated students to pursue careers in the manufacturing and food processing industries.

Brief Description of the Event: The campaign was led by Shyam Sarraf, who, along with a dedicated team, carried out the initiative over five days in different areas, interacting with residents and spreading awareness about the responsible use of water. On the first day, a visit was made to Chakraberia Rd, Paddapukur, Bhowanipur, where families were informed about the need to conserve water, especially during the summer months. Stickers were placed outside houses as a part of the campaign to reinforce the message. The second day focused on Ward no. 69, Garcha Ballygunge, where efforts continued by asking residents if they had any leaking or broken taps and noting down their addresses in a notepad. INFRASTRUCTURE DURING THE ACADEMIC SESSION JULY 2024 - JUNE 2025

Infrastructure plays an important role in the education sector. Classroom design, auditoriums, laboratories, campus area etc. are crucial elements of a learning environment. The high-quality infrastructure facilitates better instruction, improves student outcomes, and reduces dropout rates, among other benefits. The institution offers undergraduate Honours programmes in Arts, Commerce, Management and Science, as well as postgraduate courses in English and Commerce. It also runs several career-oriented courses like Commerce+, Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), Certified Financial Planner (CFP), Corporate Communications, Capital Market, Cyber Security and Global Management Skills, which takes students beyond the rigid framework of a syllabus and provides holistic development for students. In order to ensure the smooth running of all these programmes and

courses the institution has a structured policy for augmentation, replacement and maintenance of infrastructure by a dedicated team of maintenance staff. The policy ensures that- that the academic infrastructure of the College vis a vis its current requirements are assessed regularly and steps are taken to correct any deficiencies or imbalances, proper maintenance and upgradation of all laboratories is conducted regularly, new books, journals and periodicals are added to the library every year according to the needs of the students and the teachers. resources which are available from Government bodies like UGC, DST to improve the laboratories, are garnered and improvements are undertaken to benefit the students. At present the campus area is 16894 sq m with 72 WiFi/ LAN enabled smart classrooms, 32 well equipped laboratories, 7 Computer Labs and 7 ICT-enabled Seminar Halls.

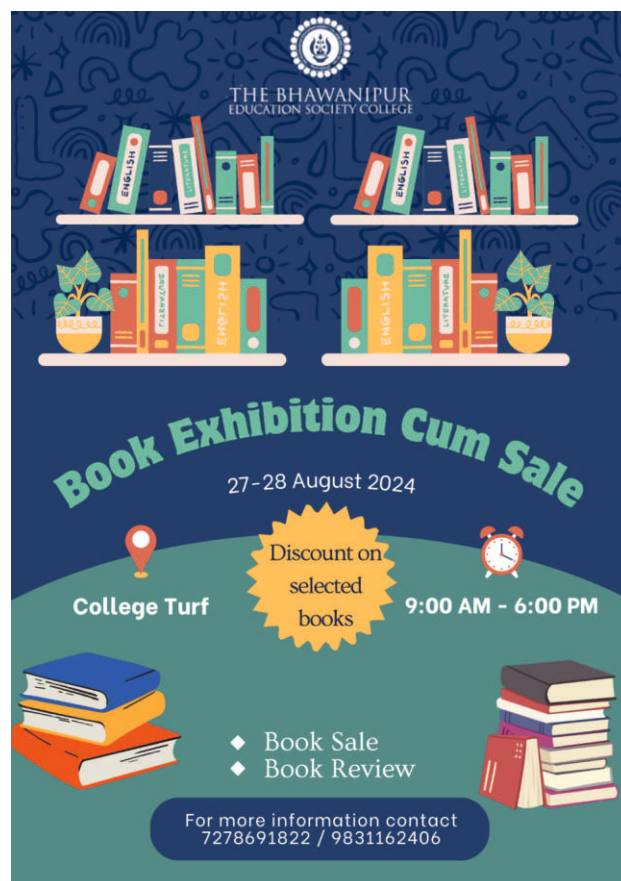

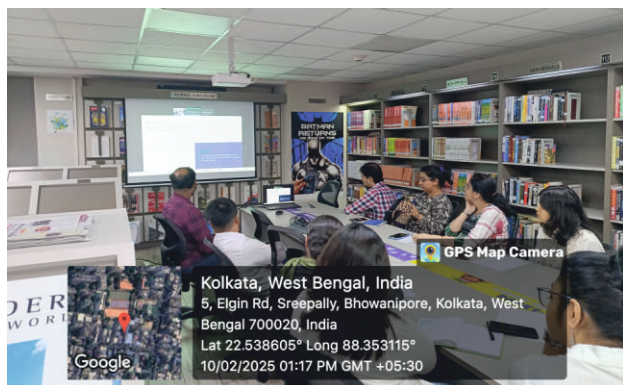

STRENGTHS AND CHALLENGES

Strengths

1. Established in 1966, accredited with NAAC 'A' and University of Calcutta-affiliated, a trusted choice for students and parents.
2. ISO 9001:2015 (Quality) and ISO 14001:2015 (Environment) in force, signalling disciplined processes, continuous improvement, and a sustainability ethos.
3. The college has sixteen UG and PG programmes backed by more than two hundred extracurricular programmes, enabling holistic development and strong student engagement.
4. Robust placement ecosystem attracting TCS, EY, PwC, Deloitte, Oracle, Axis Bank, KPMG, IndiGo, etc., a visible bridge from classroom to career.
5. Industry-aligned short courses (ACCA, CA Foundation, Digital Marketing, Power BI, Tally, etc.) with mentoring and placement assistance that directly enhance employability.
6. The college offers modern learning infrastructure with campus-wide Wi-Fi, smart classrooms, multiple auditoriums, an indoor sports arena, a turfed court, and a state-of-the-art five thousand sq. ft. library.
7. Recent distinctions (e.g., ET Best Education Brand 2025, Times Now Excellence in Education, Best BBA College, Eastern India) reinforce credibility and positioning.
8. An active IQAC anchors outcome-based practices, periodic reviews, and stakeholder feedback, ensuring systematic improvements.
9. The college has quality teachers backed by financial assistance for PhD and funding to attend seminars, conferences, FDPs, and workshops, which act as a retention lever.
10. Decentralised, participative governance empowers faster decisions and shared accountability.
11. Non-teaching staff enjoy PF loans, ESI, PMJJBY, PMSBY, free medical check-ups, and tuition fee waivers for wards; recognition via the Phagun event fosters dignity and belonging.
12. Proactive celebration of national and international commemorative days, events, and festivals, nurturing harmony across cultural, regional, and linguistic diversities.

Weakness

1. Paucity of physical space, which is typical of an urban college, being partially mitigated through the purchase of adjacent property.
2. No on-campus playground has limited outdoor sports.
3. Lack of hostel adjoining the campus.
4. Strong competition from private and other urban state-aided colleges makes the college ensure an evolving USP to stand out in admissions, placements, and research/innovation visibility.
5. The research ethos of the college needs boost in the form of indexed publications, grants and patents.

Opportunity

1. Planned recruitments of faculty to Improve student-teacher ratio enabling better mentoring and research supervision.
2. Retention of quality teachers by strengthening faculty development, research support, and recognition to reduce attrition and build long-term academic capital.
3. Systematic invited talks, masterclasses, by industry practitioners needed to keep curricula current and networks active.
4. New programmes (UG and PG) may be added along with value-added certifications.
5. More MoUs, national and international, for internships, faculty exchanges to enhance placements and entrepreneurship.
6. Visible campus sustainability projects may be launched within the campus like composting, rain water harvesting and installation of solar panels.

Challenges

1. Frequent syllabus and examination procedural changes often outpace the faculty readiness.
2. Space saturation since three streams run simultaneously during the day shift.
3. Intensifying competition from private & state-aided colleges.
4. Sectoral slowdowns and rapid technological changes are reducing offer volumes and altering job profiles.
5. Faculty retention is affected by the private universities and HEIs which outbid or offer richer research ecosystems.
6. Being an affiliated college following the curriculum designed by the University of Calcutta, it is often observed that there is curriculum obsolescence in fast-moving domains (AI, data, fintech).

FUTURE PLANS

Building on the achievements of 2024-2025, the college will focus on the following strategic priorities:

Pursuit of Autonomy

Having secured NAAC A grade accreditation in the second cycle, the college will now work towards fulfilling all requirements for attaining autonomous status, thereby enhancing academic flexibility, curriculum innovation, and institutional stature.

The college plans to introduce new interdisciplinary and skill-based programmes and certificate courses in emerging areas such as Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning applications, Social Media Strategy and Digital Branding, Data Analytics for Business Decisions, Sustainability Studies, and Creative Industries.

Research Enhancement

Strengthen research output through faculty development initiatives, research grants, and collaborations with national and international institutions.

Digital Transformation

Fully integrate ERP systems across all academic and administrative functions, expand blended and online learning platforms, and introduce virtual laboratories and simulation tools.

Infrastructure Development

Establish a dedicated Research and Innovation Centre, Incubation Centre, upgrade library resources with AI-enabled cataloguing, and implement more green energy and eco-friendly campus initiatives like composting and solar energy usage.

Global Engagement

Build partnerships with international universities for student and faculty exchanges, joint research projects, and collaborative conferences.

Student Development and Well-being

Enhance mentorship, career guidance, and industry-connect programmes, along with comprehensive mental health and wellness services.

Community Outreach and Social Responsibility

Strengthen NSS and NCC initiatives, rural development projects, health camps, and open dialogues towards village adoption and/or school adoption to address societal challenges.
